Get a partner and come along on Thursday night you can play with anyone within your own division, or mix with someone from another division. If you want to play, put your name down on the entry form in the foyer, or contact John Clarke or Pat Dennis, who will assist you.
- ➤ Teams Entries (including Mixed Teams): The various teams competitions will commence immediately following the No Fears Bridge competition, on a Thursday. We encourage all to get their entries in as soon as possible forms are in the foyer for this purpose.

In particular, it would be great to have a separate Junior Teams competition this year – which can only occur if there are sufficient entries from Junior ranked players, so get together and make-up a team for a once a month commitment. Playing in these teams competitions can really help you progress with your Bridge play. If you have any queries about these competitions, just ask any Committee member, or a senior player, who will be able to assist.
