DIRECTORS' NEWS-WHO DOES WHAT?

Have you ever wondered what the initials on the Directors' Roster are for? Did you know the Directors' Roster is on the tiny notice board between the main door and the kitchen...

- **D** This is the Director for the night. Their duties are to set up and run the room for the night. Including going to Director calls and reading out the results.
- SD Support Director. They should check the set up of the room before play commences.
- AD Assistant Director. They should make themselves known to the Director at the beginning of the night. They should collect all the boards at the end of play and put them in the appropriate cupboard. If teams night, they should liaise with Jean Tisdall about whether it is appropriate to put spare tables and the Board numbers on those tables away.

All Directors should answer calls in the room if they are free.

All Players are responsible for getting their own rubbish bins and making sure the bins are emptied at the end of the night. Each table top should be tidy, and chairs pushed in. Check the Supper Roster and Directing Roster as you walk into the room, on the whiteboard straight in front of the main door.

4 Card majors

Weak 2's 2 D, 2H and 2S - 6 card suit - and 6-10 HCP

2C 20+ HCP – Game Force

(GF – keep bidding to game)

2NT 20-22 HCP

If you are not comfortable playing this – please don't offer to play with them.

BRIDGE TIPS by Frances Sheehy TRANSFERS

Transfers are bids in response to your partner's bid of 1NT or 2NT. Transfers are especially useful when partner is weak so that the opener (with the stronger hand) becomes declarer rather than dummy if a weak takeout is used.

How to use transfers

In response to 1NT opening:-

1. With a weak hand

- A With 5+ Hearts, responder bids 2D which is a transfer to Hearts. Opener <u>MUST</u> bid 2H.
- B With 5+ Spades, responder bids 2H which is a transfer to Spades. Opener <u>MUST</u> bid 2S.
- C With 6+ Clubs or Diamonds, responder bids 2S which is a transfer to Clubs. Opener <u>MUST</u> bid 3C and responder passes or converts to 3D.

2. With 10-12 HCP (Invitational)

Responder can bid again eg over 2S, with 6+ Spades, bid 3S or with 5 Spades, bid 2NT

3. With 13+ HCP (Game Hand)

Responder can jump eg over 2S, with 6+ Spades, bid 4S or with 5 Spades, bid 3NT

In response to 2NT opening(20-22 HCP):-

Bid 3D, transfer to Hearts 3H, transfer to Spades

Interference

If opponents Double or Overcall your 1NT opening bid, then Transfers are **NOT APPLICABLE**.

Alerts

When making a transfer bid, the Opener must alert the opposition by the usual circling of the partner's bid.
