From the Law Book


Any lead out of turn becomes a correct lead if declarer or either defender accepts it by

North-south played it in 1NT twice, in 2 NT twice, and in 3C once (what happened??

East-West played it in 3NT once (disaster), and once each in 2D, 2H, 2S, and 3H.
