BARBARA'S BRIDGE TIPS by Barbara Seagram

I still love the title of this book so thought I would find some more tips from it.

PREEMPTS—HOW TO UPSET THE OPPONENTS

Preempts are opening bids at the three-level with a weak and long suit which are designed to make life difficult for the opponents. You have to recognise that it is better to go down 2 or 3 tricks than let them make game—especially if they are vulnerable.

You can be friskier with your pre-empts in 3rd chair (i.e. your partner has passed) as you won't risk missing slam but never pre-empt in 4th seat.

Requirements for an opening bid at the 3 level include the following:

- \Rightarrow You must have a good quality 7 card suit e.g. Q J 10 8 7 3 2—absolute minimum hand.
- \Rightarrow No more than one Ace or King outside your trump suit.
- \Rightarrow Less than 10 HCP or don't pre-empt.
- \Rightarrow If you have a 4 card major then don't open unless your partner has already passed.

If you pre-empt at the 4-level then this would show an 8 card suit.

As a responder you need to have a good 15+ points to respond if you think there is game. A lot depends on which suit your partner has pre-empted in.
