- Our next tournament we are holding is the Taieri Pairs 5A Open Tournament on 12<sup>th</sup> June. Starting at 9.30 a,m with play underway by 10 a.m.
- Otago Club are holding "Save the Children" Charity Pairs on 21<sup>st</sup> May. Start time is 1.30 but you need to be seated 15 minutes earlier. Cost is \$10.00.
- On the same date is Te Anau 8B Open Pairs.
- Gore 3B Junior and 5B Intermediate Pairs will be held on May 28<sup>th</sup>. Entries close 23<sup>rd</sup> May. Cost is \$20.00 per player.

**From the Archives:** The first AGM of the club was held in November 1974. Unfortunately one of the original elected members had to resign due to ill health and was replaced by Nancy Hawker. Nancy is the only surviving member of that first committee.

**Monday Systems:** The program tells us that players should only play systems allowable for Junior Tournaments. The programme also says these are posted on the noticeboard. For those who can't find them, here are a few examples. From the 2016 Manual D50.

NB The bids in Red are allowed in Intermediate Tournaments. Something to think about for 2017

**Visitors:** We have a reputation as a friendly club. If you bring a visitor along, please make sure the Director knows so that they can be properly welcomed.

**For the Director:** Surely a 6½ table Mitchell movement must be about the worst one could possibly find? Suppose the director puts the phantom NS and decides to play 27 boards. Those sitting NS notice nothing – they get to play 27 boards.

Those sitting EW get the phantom and play 24 boards – but two pairs get the phantom twice and only play 21 boards.

But there's more—those starting at table 4 get the same opposition 3 times for 9 boards!!.
