He achieved junior club champ in 2018 and his name will always be on our honours board. On club nights he always bought some fun and laughter saying 'me mates' and 'me pals' (in his pommy accent).

Alan and I attended lessons in 2016 and even though he hadn't played Bridge before he had played a lot of card games and he would give my friend and I a hard time for not being card savvy asking why we didn't know what had been played, or what side the points were sitting on, I think he thought we were a bit thick but I persevered and finally last year (seven years later) he gave me a compliment saying I was finally card wise.
