### Housekeeping

#### The BridgePad Batteries

The south player enters the result of a hand on the BridgePad. As soon as the "next" button is pressed that result is transmitted to the server, but the result is also stored in the BridgePad so that the Director can retrieve that entry later if necessary. If the batteries are removed during play the BridgePad memory is cleared and that information is lost. If the "Batteries are getting low" message appears, either call the Director or wait until the end of the session. DO NOT REMOVE THE BATTERIES DURING PLAY. Also it's much easier to call the director should you notice something weird or untoward is happening as it is easier to fix during play.

**Phantom Table** – If you are sitting at a half table and are unsure what to enter for the missing pair in the bridge pad – please enter "0" for each missing person.

## **Alerting**

- If you are playing a natural NT opening, partner should immediately announce the range, "12-14" or whatever range you are using
- If you open 1C partner should immediately announce the length of the Club suit such as "2+", "3+", "4+" etc

#### Self-alerting calls which do NOT require alerting

- Doubles
- Redoubles
- Cue bids of opponent's suit
- Conventional bids at the 4 level or higher
- 2C game force (and 2D negative response)
- Simple 2C Stayman response to 1NT opening
