# **Bridge Rules & Etiquette**

This week we look at the rules governing the conduct of Dummy.

#### Law 42 – Dummy's Rights

Dummy may give information in the Directors presence, keep count of tricks won or lost and play the cards as indicated by declarer. Dummy is also entitled to try and prevent any irregularity by declarer but NOT by defender.

#### Law 43 – Dummy's Limitations

Dummy must not participate in play nor communicate anything about play to declarer (expect as stated above – Law 42). Should an irregularity in play occur, Dummy must NOT draw attention to this during play not initiate a call for the Director.

Simply, to ensure fair play, Declarer should indicate very clearly the cards to play and Dummy should keep quiet!If you want to know more, please refer to the Laws of Duplicate Bridge.

## Wanaka Mixed Teams 2013

The mixed teams tournament starts on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> April and runs over 5 or 7 nights (see bridge book for dates).

To avoid byes we need 6 or 8 teams to play over 5 or 7 nights. Last year we had 8 teams with 3 teams still vying for first place on the last night.

Teams consist of 2 bronze and 2 silver players so find some friends and register for this exciting event.

#### Format

- Each team will play every other team over the scheduled 5- 7 nights in a round robin. Points will be aggregated from each match to determine the overall winner.
- 2. Each match will consist of 24 boards played in 3 sets of 8. Silver pair vs silver pair and bronze pair vs bronze pair followed by two lots of mixed pair vs mixed pair. This means each team member plays with each of the other 3 team members.
- 3. Captains are responsible for fielding a full team each night. If you can't play they should be informed in sufficient time for a reserve to be found. Captains can get the convener to assist if necessary. Please use reserves when necessary as default scores of 25-0 distort results.
